A MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

Jesus said that the church is the vehicle through which His Kingdom would come and His redemptive purposes accomplished. How we individually and together as a church, respond to His leading, will determine, to a great extent, whether we ever achieve what He has called us to be and do as a church.

On a number of occasions over our 60-year history, we found ourselves at a crossroad. Like ancient Israel, God brought us to the threshold of a 'new land' of opportunity, impact and blessing. Each time, we had a choice to make: would we step out into the 'faith adventure' we believed He was calling us to, or would we shrink back and let fear, pessimism and lack of faith prevent us from experiencing all He has for us? The significant spiritual and numerical growth we have witnessed over the past decades is testimony not only to the prayers, godly leadership and sacrificial generosity and service of God's people, but also how God blesses us when we trust Him and step out in obedience to His call.

This past year the eternal trajectory of hundreds of Calgarians were forever changed and hundreds more across Canada and around the world were impacted through our more than 100 partner churches and agencies. In large part this was the fruit of many of you stepping out in faithful obedience to God's call to pray, to give, to serve and to reach out in love to 'people of peace' the Lord brought into your life. You invited them into your home, to your community group, to one of our outreach events and/or to one of our worship gatherings. You helped us bless them and to allow them to experience the love of our church community and hear the good news of Jesus without distraction, by faithfully serving in one of a hundred ways, praying, leading, speaking, singing, cleaning, greeting and loving and teaching children (just to name a few). You stepped up and not only gave financially to the ministry and mission of our church, but also committed to give above and beyond your regular giving in support of our 'BUILD more room for God' initiative.

This past year, we once again found ourselves at a crossroad. An internal review of our ministries revealed that our potential to continue impacting more lives was being stifled by space constraints — particularly our Children's, Special Needs, Compassion and NW Campus ministries.

After much prayer, dialogue and deliberation, we decided as a church to step out in faith again and follow God's leading to 'BUILD more room for God' in our lives and facilities. The gift of 11 acres of land from the Damkar family, the sale of our West Campus to a Christian organization for \$8.5 million, nearly \$10 million in our savings, and the faith pledges many of you made, amounting to nearly \$15 million over the next three years, all served to confirm God's leading to move forward with construction.

Finally, this past year we took another big step of faith through the 'By Design' series, in which we took a deep dive into the Scriptures on how God designed us as humans in terms of our bodies, identity, gender desires, singleness and marriage and how we as a church can be a loving, safe place where people struggling with these and other challenging areas can find truth, love and hope. We devoted over 10 weekend worship services and five months of classes and workshops through the week to do the series. While not everyone was in agreement with our biblical convictions as a church, many expressed how informative, helpful and challenging the series was.

In your hands are some of the reflections of how God has blessed us this past year. They are only a 'snapshot' of God's amazing activity among us. The statistics and stories in this annual report never get old to me, because they represent what God is doing in the lives of people. Behind every statistic is a story. Take the time to read this report and give thanks to God for all He has done and continues to do among us. Pray with us that God would continue to pour out His Spirit, grace and blessing, and that many lives would be changed through us. And together, let's lean into His call on our lives with expectant hope, so we can love God, love each other and love our world.

It is such a joy and privilege to serve alongside our staff and many of you in Jesus' name. To Him be all the glory!







OVERFLOWING GIFTS

A CSC Community Group was recently able to provide gifts, money and food in a Christmas hamper to a single mom of two boys, one of whom is severely autistic. They wanted to see that this was her best Christmas ever! All she had asked for was a gas card and cleaning supplies, which she could not afford. She was completely overwhelmed and cried because of the incredible generosity. To God be the glory!

CARED FOR AND LOVED

One woman shared that she is someone who has struggled her whole life to know that she is loved, and that she has a place. She has struggled with isolation and loneliness, and wondered if there was anyone who cared for her or would be her friend. Compassionate Ministries recently launched the "Compassionate Friends" program and we have already seen friendships and relationships begin to flourish! This woman now has an intentional friend who takes time to pray with her and is simply there to let her know she is cared for and loved by Jesus.

WELCOMED, ENCOURAGED AND SUPPORTED

A new volunteer started playing bass and acoustic guitar on a South Campus worship team. When he started to serve, he said, "I have never felt more welcomed, encouraged and supported on a worship team in my life. People automatically introduced themselves, and genuinely want to know who I am, and they really care about me."

GOD IS MOVING IN TARADALE

A group in Taradale has seen five new people come to know the Lord in the last year. The leaders and the group members have also been fervently praying for the leader's son and girlfriend. They have now both committed their lives to Jesus and are being disciplined by the group! God is alive and moving!

PURSUE MISSION

Jesus invited a small group of others to be on mission with Him. Following His example, we are committed to being on mission with our family and friends — to introduce people to Jesus by serving them (acts of caring, compassion and justice), sharing Jesus with them personally and inviting them to be part of our small group and worship gatherings.



CALLED TO SERVE

When Cyclone Idai devastated the African nation of Mozambique in March, the world stood stunned at the extent of the damage. In the aftermath, livelihoods have been lost, hundreds of people have died, and hundreds of thousands more have been displaced. The ongoing effects have been equally tragic, children are losing valuable months of education, crops upon which the people depend have been destroyed, and thousands of Mozambicans are succumbing to illness and injury. It will be a long time before the country is restored to what it once was, but this disaster has provided an opportunity for God's people to be His hands and feet.



One such person who has answered that call is Suzanne George, a CSC member and a nurse who is serving with Samaritan's Purse in the areas most affected. Her team at the Samaritan's Purse field hospital sees over 100 people each day. Whatever the injury or ailment, they seek to serve with compassion.

One particularly vulnerable group is expectant mothers. Several babies have been delivered at the field hospital and emergency treatment has been administered to many more pregnant women. Another issue they face in the field is dehydration from a lack of uncontaminated food and water sources. There are also many coming in with wounds because they lack adequate protection as they navigate areas flooded with debris. People are truly suffering.

"We have a lot of people without shoes whose houses have been torn apart. We are able to dress a lot of wounds and provide the medication they need," said Suzanne. The days are long and grueling. Suzanne and her team are treating people they may not be able to save. What compels her to serve in such a way?

"I've always wanted to work in disaster relief. I believe that God has laid that on my heart since I was very young. I do believe that God equips and calls us to different things, and to be living in the purpose to which He has called me is really amazing."

Her hope is that the people being treated are healed beyond their physical bodies. She desires that they have a personal encounter with the living Christ and that He changes their entire lives. "I wonder if they wonder why these people are spending so much time and energy to help them. I hope they understand it's because we love them and they are valuable."

God may not be calling you across the globe to serve in disaster-stricken areas, but He does call us to Christ-like servanthood wherever we are. Psalm 147:3 says "He heals the brokenhearted and bandages their wounds." How can we serve the brokenhearted and hurting people God has placed in our paths?



A man comes week after week to 'The Well.' He has accessed services from Compassionate Ministries before, but it has been a long road, and now he is ready and determined for change. In this place, he tells us, he feels peace, senses God and asks us to help. Compassionate Ministries exists to serve people who God calls to CSC, to help them find a better end to their story!

"Thank you so much for helping to make my life brighter for myself, my son and my father. We have such low income and try to help each other as we can, but our lives are so difficult after we pay the bills with the meager resources we have; it is because of Centre Street Church and Compassionate Ministries that our life has become more blessed as you have provided food, love and hope."

It has been an exciting year for Compassionate Ministries. Only three years into the ministry’s launch, and God is doing great things through our volunteers and in the lives of people who come in search of help and hope.

Here are some examples of the programs and highlights of this Ministry that are so important to the mission of our church as we expand to BUILD even more room for compassion in the name of Jesus.

FOOD AS A DOORWAY

Food hampers: CSC, in partnership with the Calgary Food Bank, provides food hampers three times per week to families in need. Many families return again and again, not just for food and clothes, but for love, fun and community.

Monday night drop-ins and monthly community meals at West Campus are specifically designed for building connection with people in deep poverty. People will often come to use the food bank or clothing bank and come into our café called ‘The Well’ to enjoy a hot drink, some games, and a listening ear.

LIFE JOURNEY

Each week food gatherings and ministries serve as potential doorways for deeper life change as we make connections and book appointments with emergency needs or a desire to make big change in their lives.

Step One: An initial assessment allows Compassionate Ministry volunteers to provide short term relief for people’s practical needs. First steps are an opportunity to show the love of Jesus, and plant seeds of faith.

Step Two: Volunteers use a Life Budget approach to gain greater understanding of each person’s needs (financial, intellectual, physical, social and spiritual) so they can create an action plan to support each ‘friend’ or ‘neighbour’ more deeply and connect them to a supportive Christian community.

Step Three: (Compassionate Friends Program): This program is all about building Christian community and connection with people in need pursuing deeper life change. Of the hundreds of people we meet yearly, many are isolated and we believe people have greater — long term success with strong Christian community and connection. In this program, CSC congregation members are matched with individuals in an intentional friendship and mentoring relationship as they follow their Life Budget action plan.



PARTNERSHIP WITH CANADIAN MENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION

Compassionate Ministries has seen a growing number of people coming with diagnosed or non-diagnosed mental health issues. Knowing CSC needed to be more intentional and equipped to serve people with mental health challenges, a collaborative partnership was established between CSC and the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA). Compassionate Ministries has expanded partnerships with other organizations and people, offering expertise in walking closely with those struggling with mental health issues. This includes the 'Calgary Scope Society' which has offered training to CSC leadership in identifying particular types of mental illness, engaging with the appropriate community supports, including City of Calgary social workers and area agencies who have indicated that they see CSC as a local church leader in offering welcome, belonging and hope to those in poverty struggling with a variety of disorders.



We celebrate along with Cherie who has been journeying with Compassionate Ministries to help her move forward with her life (in the areas of meeting practical needs, budgeting and making future plans away from poverty) and who is now doing life at Centre Street Church and has been accepted into Bible College!

SUPPORT

God is leading us to new ways and opportunities to support people in cycles of poverty.

Career Connection Network

While our ministry provides support to those living in poverty, we also we seek to minister in ways that promote sustainability to people in need. The Career Connection Network (CCN) offers resources such as budgeting, resume writing help and job search skills to help people explore job opportunities in the city. Some are now finding employment, where previously they were without work for months or years.

WHY BUILD MORE ROOM FOR COMPASSIONATE MINISTRIES?

Out of partnership with The Calgary Food Bank, Centre Street Church lives out a mission for people to walk through a doorway where they will not only be fed for an evening, but for life. We want to see people find resources, community and deeper meaning in the name of Jesus. To accommodate growing crowds with diverse needs, we need to BUILD more spaces that are designed with a missional purpose.

One of the dreams and prayers to God is that we would have more room for opportunities to form missional community between the poor and those called to serve in the name of Jesus. 'The Well' provides living water that people thirst for.

Compassionate Ministries desires to provide a place of gathering, relationship and hope. A monthly meal (which is often the best hot meal people we serve receive) is one of the ways we show people they are loved and cared for. In their own words, because of this meal and other services we provide, people call CSC "home."

PURSUE GENEROSITY

Our hearts break over the things that break the heart of God. Therefore, we are committed to being the hands and feet of Jesus by being generous with our time, finances, abilities and spiritual gifts to accomplish the mission God has called us to as individuals, families and as a church in our city, nation and world.




This year, we continued our journey into deeper generosity at CSC by increasing our Global Missions giving from 18 per cent to 18.5 per cent of our budget. Starting July 1, 2019, we have brought this up to 19 per cent, bringing us closer to our goal of 20 per cent of our annual budget going to our global mission.

Our journey to 'BUILD more room for God' is in full swing. As of August 2019, together we have together raised **\$8 million**, and both the initial stages of Northwest Campus construction and the completion of conceptual drawings for Central Campus expansion are well under way.

In 2016, I was called to go do missions overseas for 15 months and though I was relatively new here, I was amazed at the ways that community came around me. Though most of them were young adults, everyone helped me in such practical ways. I saw in that season that my friends truly had the best in mind for me. They wanted me to succeed, even if it meant giving up their most valuable resources, time and money.


PURSUE SIMPLICITY



A JOURNEY THROUGH THE MEMORIES OF CENTRE STREET CHURCH.

We celebrated the end of 2018 — our 60th anniversary year — by offering a special Christmas gift. *Living Stones* is a history book that chronicles an unexpected journey into the memories of people who have travelled through thick and thin in the history of our church. The book is uniquely written from the point of view of YOU, the congregation member. As you visit with around one hundred godly individuals, you learn how their lives were impacted by historical moments at CSC and how God has used us in our gifts and our weaknesses to grow our church in its love for God, love for each other and love for the world.

The missional intent of *Living Stones* is to capture and celebrate an important Canadian history story, while also providing discipleship to readers as they reflect on the challenges, mistakes, learnings and triumphs of building a truly God-honouring church community over the decades. It's about going beyond the "Sunday service," beyond "religion" and beyond the four walls of the building to bring the love of Jesus to the people and places God puts on our hearts. This journey was first intended to capture memories for CSC's 60th Anniversary but resulted in enough stories and insights to fill three books. Each book offers unique insights on God building His church against the backdrop of shifting times and norms of society. Book 1 is available to pick up at your campus and Book 2 will be available later in 2019.

MORE ROOM FOR GOD

Over the last year, with God's help, we took many important steps in our projects to 'BUILD more room for God.' We even saw our BUILD funding support the finalization of church construction projects in South Africa and Ukraine. Here are some of the latest BUILD project highlights:

UPDATED PLANS AND DRAWINGS

In early 2019 we finalized and shared drawings for the Northwest Campus. A few months later, we completed initial drawings for the Central Campus expansion and applied for the Development Permit, with an anticipated 12-18 month approval timeline. Over the last year, our drawings and plans were shared with members of the community, Rocky View County and ministry leaders. As a result of these engagements, both of our projects saw changes to our initial construction plans and costs. SOD TURNING CEREMONY AT NORTHWEST CAMPUS

On May 5th, we hit an exciting milestone in our BUILD journey — we marked the first steps of our Northwest Campus construction with prayer, worship and the official sod turning ceremony. Everybody, young and old, set out on buses to visit the land before construction began. People representing all campuses watched as families and leaders lined up to turn the sod, giving thanks to God for all He has provided.

Meanwhile, we held our annual BUILD offering to celebrate the first anniversary of our journey to 'BUILD more room for God.' We celebrated a baptism, a testimony and another opportunity to write the names of loved ones on stones, representing our commitment to pray for those who do not yet know Jesus. These stones have been included in the new Northwest Campus construction.



CONGREGATIONAL MEETINGS

On June 17th and 18th, we celebrated God's hand in our journey to BUILD while sharing important project updates. We enjoyed live storytelling, a virtual tour of the Central Campus expansion, an update of our financial strategy and a message from Pastor Henry. Following the meeting we enjoyed food and fellowship in the Atrium, where congregation members were welcome to look at detailed drawings and ask questions

NORTHWEST CAMPUS CONSTRUCTION

Construction on the property officially began in June 2019. Although there were some project delays due to flooding mitigation efforts during the heavy rains of late June and early July, by God's grace we made progress this summer. By the end of October 2019, it is anticipated that the footings and foundational walls will be completed along with the majority of groundwork and site rough grading.

AN EXCITING YEAR AHEAD...

With your prayers and support, we anticipate the following major milestones in the coming months:

- Northwest Campus: construction to continue over the next year with final stages of concrete pour in October. With God's help, we anticipate construction completed Fall 2020.
- Central Campus: conceptual drawings to be completed following staff consultation from the summer and construction drawings to be complete by the end of 2019. We hope to receive our Development Permit from the City of Calgary sometime in 2020.

We will keep you updated on new developments at our Airdrie, South and Bridgeland Campuses, as well as construction projects of churches and ministry centres through our Global Missions commitment to tithing 10% of all donations toward BUILD.

BUILDING ROOM IN OUR LIVES

We've also been hearing and sharing many stories about how God has been moving in the room we are building for Him, not just in our church but in our lives. People are stepping out in new ways to sacrifice their time and finances, to serve, and to give as an act of worship. Many people have been sharing how these bold new steps have deepened their spiritual walk with God.
