FAMILY FAVORITE RECIPES:

It's always so good to hear from our Maranatha family. Arnie and Sandy McIellan are being used of the Lord to help ailing neighbors during this time of pandemic. Sandy has sent in this delectable recipe for Sparkling Lemonade Cookies. I can almost taste them already!

Sparking Lemonade Cookies:

- 1 cup butter
- 1 cup white sugar
- 2 eggs
- 3 cups flour
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 6 oz. can lemonade, thawed, using 2/3 cup
- sugar in a clean salt shaker

Preheat over to 375.

In electric mixer bowl beat butter for 30 seconds, add sugar and beat until fluffy. Add eggs and mix well. Beat in $\frac{1}{2}$ of thawed lemonade concentrate and then add he remaining flour and beat until well mixed.

Drop by rounded teaspoon onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake 10-12 minutes. Cook for 10 minutes and then lightly brush top of cookies with remaining lemonade concentrate. Sprinkle lightly with sugar (use a clean salt shaker with sugar in it instead of salt).

Note: The thawed lemonade is enough to make two batches of these cookies.

FRAUD ONLINE WORKSHOP:

Frauds and Scams are a part of the world in which we live. As seniors, we need to be aware of how this can affect our every day lives. We had hoped to have an onsite workshop that could teach us about the hazards of frauds and scams. However, during this time of pandemic we have prepared a four-part series printed for you in the Maranatha Digest. This educational workshop has been prepared by Irene Edwards who participated in a Frauds and Scams Prevention Workshop presented by the Carya Society of Calgary.

What is Fraud?

- Fraud implies a deception. It is a breach of confidence or trust.
- A serious crime and a violation of civil law.
- Various motivations (gain prestige or financial advantage, creating doubts about an opponent).

What is a Scam?

- A fraudulent scheme (may involve money and a business transaction).
- Various forms. You win a prize but must reveal your credit card details or are asked to donate money to a charity that does not exist using your credit card.
- Various ways, via telephone, email or even in person.
- Less than 5% of scams are reported.



- Fraud: Using another person's medical card to get services.
- Fraud: Billing 20% more than the actual amount of the goods they purchased.
- Fraud: Someone accepting cash for giving a construction company political favours.
- Scam: Pop-up on your computer that you have been selected as a winner of a contest, but first you have to send your personal details.
- Scam: An email/phone call from CRA or a charitable organization asking for our personal credit details.
- Scam: You received an email that you won \$5 million.

Who is at risk?

- Anybody and everybody.
- Potential victims are individuals who: Are home during the day; May be on fixed or limited incomes; Have more disposable income; Dependent person may be physically incapable of making home repairs.

Warning Signs:

- · Unusual bank withdrawals.
- Time constraints narrow window of opportunity, ie. duct & furnace cleaning (door knocking).
- Limited availability of goods and services ie. limited quantities, offer only available for 24 hours or in the area now.
