Vision Weekend: Faith Goals
October 16/17, 2021

Once a year Pastor Henry speaks about what God has done in our church, and our vision of where we believe He is leading us. In Hebrews Chapter 11, Paul focuses on faith, distinguishing between "true faith" and "misguided/false faith". He explains that without "faith" it is impossible to please God because firstly, anyone who comes to God must believe that He exists, and secondly, God rewards those who earnestly seek Him. God is looking for people who want to know Him completely, i.e. include Him in our daily life, have Him as our best friend and trust Him with our lives, so He can strengthen, bless and accomplish His will through us through the means of various assignments.

How do we exercise a God-pleasing faith for His glory, our spiritual growth, and the redemption of a world that desperately needs Jesus? Nearly fourteen years ago we sensed that God was calling us to seek His direction for the future of our church. Over a period of 18 months, Church leaders and staff sought God's will. They believed that God wanted us (as individuals and as a church) to focus on five Biblical pursuits: These are our Faith Goals.

- 1. Pursue God establishing a God-pleasing faith goal by committing commit to learning about Him through His Word and prayer. As we read Scripture, we ask God two vital questions: What are you saying to me? What do you want me to do about it?
- 2. **Pursue Relationships** step out in faith through acts of caring, sharing, inviting people to join you or your ministry; through these relationships, one or more people will embrace Christ as their Lord and Savior.
- **3. Pursue His Mission** our mission as a church is not about constructing buildings; it's about introducing people to Jesus. God uses buildings to make disciples within them. As a Church we have witnessed this in the lives of thousands of people over the history of our church.
- **4. Pursue Generosity** when Christ returns we want Him to find us committed to being generous with the gifts He gave us: time, finances, abilities and spiritual gifts. Let's use these to bring others to Him.
- 5. Pursue Simplicity we often think simplicity is about figuring out a way to do less. However, simplicity is the will to do one thing which will bring clarity to what is most important in our lives, and pursuing it with laser focus. Many people do innumerable things. Jesus said in Matthew 6: "You cannot serve two masters or two gods." If you try to do that, your life will be chaotic and you will soon be depleted emotionally and physically.

Each of us is unique: we have been blessed with a plethora of talents, spiritual gifts, abilities and experiences and we are called to use them both individually as well as collectively as a church, so we may fulfil God's redemptive purposes in the world and be ready for Jesus when He returns! Let us pray about the Faith Goals God is calling us to as individuals and communities and how they connect with the Five Pursuits above. May we put into practice the vision God has given our church!
