

sermon study summary Reclaiming Zeal

INTRODUCTION

In order to witness a corporate revival in our church, our community, and in our country today, each of us must play our part. A corporate revival can only be ushered in when we first revive our individual relationship with Jesus. In this four-part sermon series, "Revive Us Again", Pastor Ashwin discussed how we must reclaim prayer, the Word, the Spirit, and in this last part of the series, reclaim zeal.

Zeal is about loving the Lord with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. As followers of Jesus, we ought to: "never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord (Rom 12:11)". In Leviticus 6:12, God instructs us that, "the fire on the altar must be kept burning; it must not go out". Just as our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit, our hearts are the altar. Our zeal should never cease.

However, like a relationship between married couples, it is easy to lose that "first love", the spark that occurs during the start of a relationship when spending time with each other is a priority. As the monotony of married life kicks in, that spark can diminish. This can also happen in our spiritual life. When we first became Christians, we were in awe of our salvation and had a vibrant relationship with Jesus. Gradually, however, our love for Him could grow dim, and we lose our "first Love". How can we continue to be zealous for Christ? We can do so by heeding the warning Jesus gave the church of Ephesus in Revelations 2.

In their early days, the church of Ephesus was characterized by their undying love for Jesus (Eph 6:24). However, after a period of many years, we read in Revelations that although Jesus commended them for their hard work, their perseverance, and their doctrinal convictions (v2-3), He brought a serious charge before them when He said: "Yet I hold this against you: you have forsaken the love you had at first (v4)". Amid the frenzy of church activities, they had sidelined what was most important – their **individual walk with God**. Jesus warned the church of Ephesus to, "consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first (v5a)". If we do not obey Him, He will remove our lampstand from its place (v5b). Left to our own strength, we will fail to be a church of impact. Verse 5a teaches us that to reclaim zeal, we must Remember, Repent, and Repeat.

Remember. We love because He first loved us (1 John 4:19). He took our place (2 Cor 5:21) and bore the wrath of God. How humbling it is to realize that our Lord is zealous for us! Let us never stop being in awe of our salvation.

Repent. If there are other things vying for our attention and competing with our "first Love", we need to repent.

Repeat. We need to reclaim prayer, the Word, and the Spirit. Prayer, the influence of the Word, and the infilling of the Spirit ought to be ongoing in our Christian life.

May we return to our "first Love" and be characterized by our zealousness for the Lord. Was there a time when you were closer to Jesus than you are today? It all starts with a personal revival. Along with the Psalmist in Psalm 85:6, let us cry out to God: "Will you not revive us again, that our hearts may rejoice in you?"

UP - PURSUE GOD

Read Rev 2:1-7, Lev 6:12, and Rom 12:11

- 3. In Revelations, Jesus commends the church of Ephesus; however, He also gives them a warning that they should repent and return to their "first Love". Despite their hard work, perseverance, and sound doctrine, how were they failing in their efforts to please God?
- 4. What are the consequences the church will face when the members fail to keep the "fire" alive in their own hearts?

OUT - PURSUE MISSION

- 5. What steps might you take this week to revive your relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ?
 Reflect upon how the assurance of reconciliation, both now and in eternity, encourages us never to forget our "first Love".
- 6. Pastor Ashwin mentions we need to reclaim prayer, the Word, the Spirit, and zeal. As a community of unique individuals, what actions can we take this week to lead to a corporate Revival in our Church?

For Personal Reflection/Prayer:

"Was there a time when you were closer to Jesus than you are today?"

When asked what the secret of revival is, British Evangelist Gipsy Smith said, "Go home. Take a piece of chalk. Draw a circle around yourself. Then pray, 'O Lord, revive everything inside this circle.'" It all starts with a personal revival. May the cry of the Psalmist be our cry – "Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you? (Psa 85:6)"
